This age-old question has been puzzling humankind for hundreds of years. As a psychology major you will soon begin to uncover the mysteries of the human mind.

Psychology is the study of the interactions between the individual and his/her physical and social environment. As a psychology major, you will investigate the physical, cognitive, emotional and social aspects of human behavior.

Like other social scientists, those in the psychology field formulate hypotheses and collect data to test their validity. Psychologists gather information in various ways including controlled laboratory experiments, observation and interviews.

There are a variety of career opportunities available for a person with a degree in psychology. Those who

enter the field usually specialize at the graduate level in one of a number of different areas including clinical psychology, school psychology and social psychology.

Psychologists can also be found in federal agencies, businesses and private practices.

Those students who earn a bachelor's degree can find work related to their major in rehabilitation and teaching.

You will learn the facts and principles involved in learning, motivation, intelligence, personality and adjustment. You can also study the relationship between the brain and human behavior, the connection between psychology and religion, the evolution of the human personality and various mental disorders.

New students enrolled in five or more units and planning to earn an associate degree, a certificate of achievement, or a skill award must take an English and math skills assessment. In addition, new students who plan to enroll in English, mathematics or reading classes must participate in the skills assessment process.

Concurrent Enrollment for High School Students

Some programs and classes are available to current junior and senior high school students. Interested students should contact their high school counselor or the college's Admissions and Records Office.

Associate Degree

For an associate degree, a student must complete 60 degree-applicable units of work and fulfill specific general education requirements, including electives and physical education. A cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 ("C") or above is required.

Transfer Requirements

Transfer requirements can be integrated with the associate degree option so that you may receive a degree at the time of transfer. **See a counselor for specific requirements for your major. Course requirements may vary among colleges.**
