Community College Chancellor Announced

After concluding an extensive national search, the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges unanimously selected State Senator Jack Scott to be the 14th Chancellor of the state community college system. Dr. Scott will officially assume his new role as Chancellor of the 109-college system on January 1, 2009 after completing his Senate term at the end of 2008.



Before election to the Legislature in 1996, Scott served as president of Pasadena City College and Cypress College in Fullerton. He is currently the chair of the Senate Education Committee and the Senate Budget Subcommittee on Education Finance. He is a former Vice President of the Community College League of California's Chief Executive Officers board and received the League's California Community College Trustees Legislator of the Year award in 2006.

Community Colleges Receive Large Gift



Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger joined with California Community Colleges (CCC) Chancellor Diane Woodruff on Tuesday, May 6 to announce an unprecedented commitment of \$70 million from the Bernard Osher Foundation to support private scholarships for California's community college students. The commitment is made as part of the Osher Initiative for CCC students and represents the single largest gift to a community college system in the nation and one of the largest gifts ever made to higher education.

The Osher Initiative includes two separate monetary commitments that will assist students with \$1,000 scholarships at each of California's 109 community colleges. A \$50 million gift will support endowed annual scholarships, \$25 million of which is forthcoming immediately. The remaining \$25 million will be contributed to the endowment on a two-to-one match.

Azusa Pacific University to Conduct Test

Azusa Pacific University will be testing a new emergency public address (PA) system on Wednesday, May 21, at 2 p.m. Due to their close proximity to Citrus College, we may be able to hear the resulting siren and announcement. Azusa Pacific is conducting the demonstration to test the capabilities and range of their new system.

This PA system is the next step to further APU's emergency preparedness. Installation is expected by fall 2008 and the university plans to conduct similar tests on a semi-annual basis.
