Citrus College EOP&S/ **CARE** (Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education) Application

The Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (C.A.R.E.) program was established by Assembly Bill AB3103 to assist single parents in the EOP&S program who receives TANF (formerly AFDC). The goal of C.A.R.E. is to break the welfare dependency cycle by completing college level training and educational programs.

Through C.A.R.E., students receive supplemental educational support services including counseling, advisement, and peer networking activities specifically designed for low-income single parents. In addition; grants, transportation, textbooks and supplies are provided to enhance the retention and transfer rate of these academically high-risk students. Students who receive support from the EOP&S/CARE program are more successful in achieving their educational goal(s) compared to non-EOP&S/C.A.R.E. participants.

To be considered for the C.A.R.E. program, you must first meet all the EOP&S requirements and be enrolled in the program.

EOP&S Eligibility:

1. Be a California resident (as determined by the Admissions and Records office)
2. Be enrolled in 12+ units
3. Have completed no more than 35 units
4. Have not received and AA/AS degree
5. Be eligible for the Board of Governor Fee Waiver (BOGW)
6. Be considered educationally disadvantaged

CARE Eligibility:

In addition to the above EOP&S requirements you must:

1. Be single parent, head of household
2. Have at least one child under the age of 14
3. Be currently receiving TANF (formerly AFDC)
4. Be at least 18 years of age

NOTE: In order to be considered for the C.A.R.E. Program, students must have completed an EOP&S orientation, and must show documentation/verification that they are currently receiving TANF (dated within the last 30 days before orientation). Potential C.A.R.E. students are required to attend a C.A.R.E. orientation. Qualified students will be notified of the time and date.
