Administration of Justice



The Citrus College Administration of Justice Program is designed to familiarize you with the functions and relationships of the police, prosecution, courts, probation, and correctional systems of the United States.

The Administration of Justice Program offers practical and technical instruction designed to meet the increasing demand for criminal justice system employees, and to provide an opportunity for current employees to upgrade their skills. Specialized courses in areas related to your own professional and academic interests may be chosen. You may select from courses in criminal law, legal aspects of evidence, criminal investigation, traffic control, firearms, narcotics and vice control, management training and more.

An associate degree earned at Citrus may lead to career opportunities as a city police officer, deputy sheriff, highway patrol officer or correctional officer. Some supporting career opportunities include dispatcher, jailor and crime scene investigator.

If you transfer to a university and earn a bachelor's degree in Administration of Justice, you can enter the field as a Secret Service agent, FBI agent, state or federal narcotic investigator, probation officer or parole officer.

New students enrolled in five or more units and planning to earn an associate degree, a certificate of achievement, or a skill award must take an English and math skills assessment. In addition, new students who plan to enroll in English, mathematics or reading classes must participate in the skills assessment process.

Concurrent Enrollment for High School Students

Some programs and classes are available to current junior and senior high school students. Interested students should contact their high school counselor or the college's Admissions and Records Office.

Associate Degree

For an associate degree, a student must complete 60 degree-applicable units of work and fulfill specific general education requirements, including electives and physical education. A cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 ("C") or above is required.

Transfer Requirements

Transfer requirements can be integrated with the associate degree option so that you may receive a degree at the time of transfer. **See a counselor for specific requirements for your major. Course requirements may vary among colleges.**
