



Citrus College ADN: *Generic Option* Multi-Criteria for Selection

- Eligibility to apply:
- 1) An overall GPA of 2.5 or above for the core sciences: Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology with a “C” or better.
 - 2) Completion of English 101 (or equivalent) with a “C” or better.
 - 3) Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above for ALL college coursework attempted.
 - 4) Anatomy, Physiology and Microbiology must have been completed within the last five (5) years.

Cumulative GPA <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All eligible applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher • Foreign coursework will not satisfy nursing prerequisites and nursing general education coursework (BRN requirements) • Foreign coursework may be accepted to satisfy general education requirements 	20 points	4.0 = 20 points 3.5 – 3.99 = 15 points 3.0 – 3.49 = 10 points 2.5 – 2.99 = 5 points < 2.5 = unqualified	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Official transcripts for all lower and upper division courses completed at all regionally accredited U.S. institutions, <i>regardless of applicability to nursing requirements</i> will be required • AP score reports posted on official transcripts will not be granted credit without official score reports on file with Admissions and Records • Failure to submit transcripts with all grades posted will result in disqualification

<p>Relevant Healthcare Experience (work or volunteer) with direct patient care within the past 5 years at time of application</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Licensed or certified healthcare worker, e.g., Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA), Home Health Aide (HHA), Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), Paramedic, Medical Military Experience, Psychiatric Technician, Respiratory Therapist, Physical Therapist, Occupational Therapist, Radiologic Technician, Medical Sonographer, Certified Medical Assistant, Phlebotomist, etc. • Other allied health employment with direct patient contact will be considered on a case by case basis, e.g. unit-based clerical, Mental Health Worker, Healthcare related therapist or technician, etc. • Acute care refers to hospitals where a patient receives active but short-term treatment for an injury/trauma or episode of severe/sudden illness, an urgent medical condition, or during recovery from surgery • Non-acute care refers to treatment of non-urgent matters and is aimed at maintenance or long term care. It is defined as specialized multidisciplinary care in which the primary need for care is optimization of the patient's functioning and quality of life. Examples include surgery centers, physician clinics, long-term care, etc. 	<p>15 points</p>	<p><i>*Acute Direct Human Patient Care Experience</i> > 1,000 hours = 15 points OR <i>*Acute Direct Human Patient Care Experience</i> 500-999 hours = 12 points OR <i>*Non-Acute/Ancillary Personnel Experience:</i> > 1,000 hours = 10 points OR <i>**Certificate/License only = 4 points</i> OR <i>***Volunteer Experience:</i> More than 200 hours with direct human patient care contact in an <u>acute</u> care setting > 200 hours = 2 points</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicants may meet more than one qualifier in this category, but points will only be awarded for the highest qualifier 	<p>*Work Experience: Letter from current/former employer verifying employment. The letter must be on organization letterhead with an original signature and must include applicant's name, start date and end date (if applicable), employment status (full-time/part-time), total number of hours worked (from/to date), job title, department if applicable, and examples of duties including patient interaction. The letter must clearly show the total number of hours the student has worked. Hours per week is not satisfactory.</p> <p>**Certificated/Licensed Healthcare Worker (Certificate/License only): Must provide current California certificate/license including your certificate number, date of issue and date of expiration. No points will be awarded for out of state or expired licensure.</p> <p>***Volunteer Experience: The letter must be on organization letterhead with an original signature, total number of hours volunteered, and a description of duties.</p>

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<p>Proficiency or advanced level coursework in languages other than English</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Credit is awarded for languages as identified by the Chancellor’s Office. These languages may include, but are not necessarily limited to, any of the following: American Sign Language, Arabic, Chinese (including its various dialects), Farsi, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog, Languages of the Indian subcontinent & Southeast Asia 	<p>2 points</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Applicant may have one or more in this category, but maximum points awarded is 2 • Do not add points for more than one 	<p>Letter, on letterhead, from a professor, clergy, or supervisor. Letter must be specific that student is proficient in all aspects of language (speak, read, write and interpret).</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Official transcripts showing completion of 3 years of high school in same language with a “C” or better, or college coursework in the same language through the <i>intermediate level</i> with a “C” or better.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>AP or SAT II subject test score in the language: submit official scores to Admissions & Records.</p>

Proof of eligibility or receipt of financial aid that may include, but is not limited to: CA Promise Grant, Cal Grant, Pell Grant, or Cal Works. Letter from employer, on letterhead, verifying employment was at least part-time while completing prerequisites. Documentation or letter from USCIS.

NOTE:

- **Coursework from ALL colleges/universities must be submitted prior to the application. Any applicant who does not submit all coursework at the time of application shall be disqualified from consideration; or dismissed from the program.**
- Each letter/document may be used as verification for only ONE criterion. Separate documents must be submitted to receive points for each criterion: health experience, life experience and proficiency in another language. All letters must be on letterhead and must include a signature and contact information.
- All applicants are required to take the ATI TEAS®. TEAS score reports from other schools will be accepted. Students must meet or exceed the adjusted individual total cut score of 62% in order to be enrolled in the subsequent fall semester.
