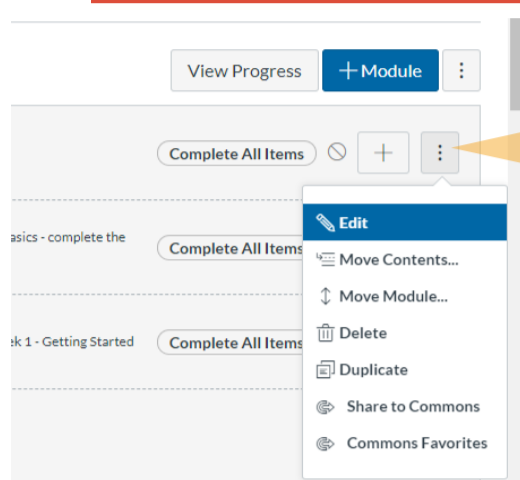


TECH TIP #4: USING MODULE SETTINGS TO GUIDE STUDENTS

You can manage the way students interact with content in your modules. Learn how module settings can reinforce content sequence and require student participation.

OPEN MODULE SETTINGS

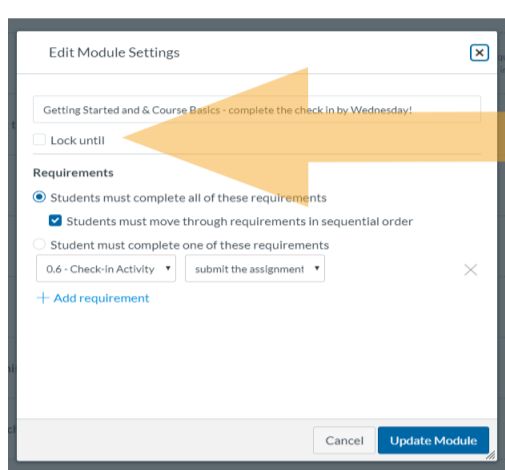

Click on the "breadcrumbs" to open the edit options for a module.

Choose "Edit" to open a window that will give you options for rules that you can apply to the module that you wish to edit.

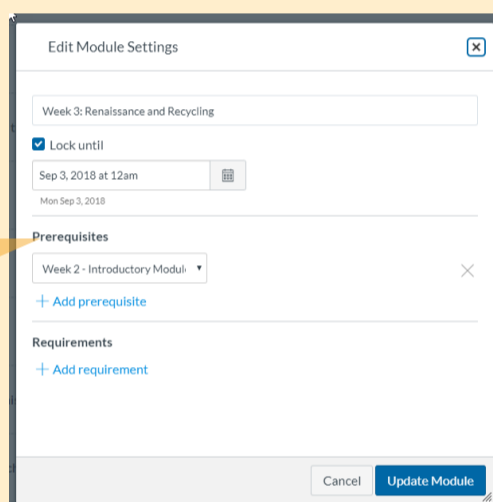
The edit window allows you to lock a module until a specified date.

Locking a module until a specific dates allows you to release content on a weekly basis and to facilitate the students' pace in your class.

PREREQUISITES

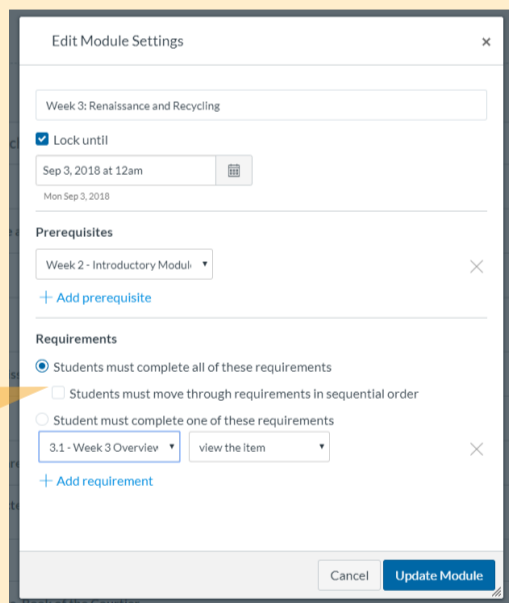
Use prerequisites to require students to view a previous module before continuing to more content.



REQUIREMENTS

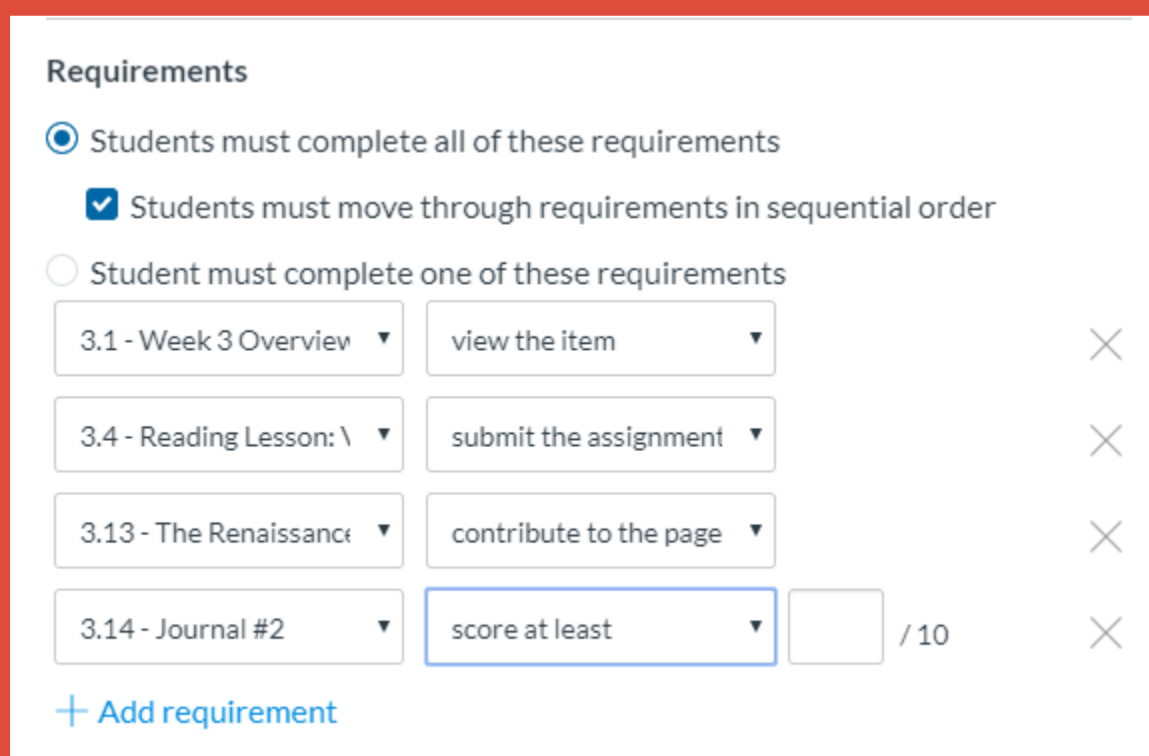
Use requirements to set activities for students to complete. You can select for students to complete all requirements or just one. You can require sequential movement.



Requirement Settings

You have a range of options for the requirement: "view the item", "submit the assignment", "contribute to the page", or "score at least".



Note: If you deactivate access to assignments, quizzes, and files in the menu, students will need to follow your module rules to access content.
